



Parking

Our parking lot is running smoothly so far this year. Please remember:

- The **bus loop** is for **busses** only
- Handicap parking is in the front parking lot (permit holders only)
- Drop-off/pick up lane pull all the way up to the front spot on the GREEN LINE.
- Once at the GREEN LINE, up to three cars can unload their children.
- Parking is at the front, to the left, and back of the school in our old lot.
- The Tzeachten lot is not accessible this year due to construction. Thank you for respecting this change.
- Our full-stop, crosswalk is in front of the school on Promontory Road please follow Mrs. Stolz's lead in crossing

Fees

Thank you for waiting until classes were set to send in your fees for supplies. You can now pay by sending cash or cheque (made out to Vedder Elementary) to your child's classroom teacher.

Fees are:

- Kindergarten, grades 1, 2 and 3 = \$45.00
- Grades 4 and 5 = \$65.00

We are fortunate to have the Cops for Cancer Team stopping by Vedder Elementary at some point in September, we are just waiting for a confirmation on the date. Chilliwack Museum Fieldtrip – Sept. 26, 27, 28

Our students will have their first, school-wide fieldtrip of the year on either Sept. 26, 27, or 28. Different grades will go on different dates to visit the exhibit "**Where are the Children**" at the Chilliwack Museum. This exhibit provides a tour of artifacts and photographs that tells how the history and effects of residential schools are ongoing. The Museum curator will lead the students through 3, 20-minutes sessions that are age-level appropriate and include a craft. The exhibition is the first of its kind in Canada, spans more than 125 years and contains photographs and documents from the 1880s to the present day.
